## Plastic Bottles and Plastic Packaging

### Plastic bottles for drinks

1. Rinse the inside
2. Remove caps and labels



Place plastic bottles and plastic packaging in separate bags.

**Do not put out on windy days.**

### Plastic packaging

#### Clean plastic packaging:

- Bottles (shampoo, detergent, etc.)
- Caps and lids
- Outer packaging film, packs, and food trays
- Cushioning materials (Styrofoam, etc.)
- Plastic bags and shopping bags

**Dirty packaging are burnable waste**



## Bottles, Cans, and Paper

Sort by type

### Glass bottles and cans (aluminum cans and steel cans)

Remove the lids and lightly rinse off any dirt or oil.

- Lids for food and drink containers (metal)
- Recyclables (cans)
- Lids for food and drink containers (plastic)
- Recyclables (plastic containers and packaging)

**Hazardous Waste: Separate from other categories and place in a single bag. Gas cartridges and spray cans Empty completely, then puncture away from fire.**



### Dry cell batteries put in separate bag

### Paper tie with string don't put out on rainy or snowy days

- Newspapers, magazines, picture books, textbooks
- Cardboard → flatten Remove adhesive tape, metal parts, etc.
- Paper cartons → rinse and cut open
- Mixed paper → place in a paper bag and tie with string
- Paper containers and packaging → items with the mark. Place in a paper bag and tie with string



## Burnable Waste

- Drained Food waste / kitchen scraps
- Cooking oil → solidify or absorb it with paper
- Clothing and fabric items
- Futons, carpets, mattresses (without springs) → roll up and tie with string, up to 2 items per collection
- ※ Mattresses with springs and carpets (6 tatami mats or larger) are bulky waste

### Garden waste

**Branches** → bundled to within 30 cm in diameter and 1 m in length, up to 2 bundles per collection

**Trunks** → within 15 cm in diameter and 1 m in length, up to 2 pieces per collection

**Grass, leaves, etc.** → up to 2 bags (45 L) per collection

● Disposable diapers → dispose of waste in the toilet

● Plastic containers, packaging, and bags with food residue or dirt (such as natto containers, seasoning tubes, etc.)

● Plastic products → items without the mark (e.g. hangers, buckets, plastic tanks—empty completely)

## Non-Burnable Waste

● Ceramics, glass, metal items, and bladed items → Wrap sharp or breakable items in paper to prevent injury

● Mercury-containing products (fluorescent tubes, mercury thermometers, etc.) → Place in a separate bag from other non-burnable waste and label the contents

● Light bulbs (LED bulbs, incandescent bulbs, etc.)

● Dirty bottles and cans

● Stoves and fan heaters

→ Remove fuel and dry-cell batteries

→ Large items (10+ kg) are bulky waste

● Electrical appliances (e.g. microwave ovens, toaster ovens, rice cookers, electric fans, etc.)

→ Large items (10 kg or more) are bulky waste

**[Used Small Electronic Devices] Please place them in collection boxes at public facilities within the city.**

Examples: PCs, mobile phones, tablet devices, video cameras, digital cameras, handheld game consoles, etc.  
→ Delete any data containing personal information  
→ **Be sure to remove batteries and rechargeable batteries**

**Caution**

Disposal of lithium-ion rechargeable batteries, button-type batteries, etc.



Because there is a risk of ignition, please do not place them at garbage collection points. They are collected at the counters of public facilities within the city.

## Bulky Waste

online application



Items that meet any of the following conditions:

- Length of 1 m or more
- Weight of 10 kg or more
- Box-shaped items with a total of width, depth, and height of 150 cm or more

[Disposal Methods]

① Apply via the online application service (available 24 hours a day) or apply by phone through the 5R Promotion Division (☎ 924-2181)

② Bring items directly to the Clean Center (¥165 per 10 kg)

※ For self-delivery, some items may be disposed of free of charge if you apply through the Waste Management Division or an administrative center.

## Special Waste

Portable toilets, toilet seats, Buddhist altars and household shrines, paint, doors and sliding doors (wooden), tatami mats, fusuma sliding doors, screen doors, large amounts of garden pruning waste, accordion curtains, large amounts of moving-related waste, etc.

→ Bring directly to a Waste Management Center (¥165 per 10 kg) or request disposal by a licensed waste disposal company (fee required).

※ For self-delivery, some items may be disposed of free of charge if you apply through the Waste Management Division or an administrative center.

## Waste that cannot be disposed of by the City

Agricultural machinery, fire extinguishers, tires, pianos, cars and motorcycles and their parts, batteries, gypsum board, gas cylinders, drums, electric water heaters, solar panels, glass wool (insulation), fireproof safes, window frames, doors, and doors (metal), uprooted wood, oil cans with contents, etc.

→ Please take them to the retailer or a licensed waste disposal company.



## Recyclable Home Appliances

Air conditioners, televisions, refrigerators and freezers, washing machines and clothes dryers

→ When replacing, take them to the retailer where you purchase the new item

→ When disposing, request collection from a retailer or purchase a recycling ticket at a post office and bring the item to the designated collection site (Nippon Express Co., Ltd., 2-12 Oroshi, Kikuta ☎ 024-983-6933)

## Pets

Place the remains in a plastic bag, then put them in a cardboard box and bring them directly to a Waste Management Center (fee required).  
※ The remains cannot be returned.



**Waste generated from shops, offices, restaurants, etc. is considered business waste and cannot be placed at garbage collection points.** →

Bring general waste directly to a Waste Management Center or use a licensed waste disposal company (fee required).

## Why not start a group resource collection program?

This is a recycling activity in which recyclable materials from households are collected by neighborhood associations, children's groups, etc., and handed over to recycling companies.

[Eligible items]

Newspapers, magazines, cardboard, textiles, metals (iron items, aluminum cans, etc.), empty bottles (sake bottles, juice bottles), etc.
