1. Living in Koriyama



Moving-in Procedures

Foreigners that plan to live in Japan for more than three months will have to register themselves as a resident. When you move to Koriyama you have to submit a “Moving-in Notification (*tennyu todoke* 転入届)” within 14 days of taking residence. You can find more information about your residence card and status of residence on the [Immigration Services Agency Website](#).

Necessary Documents to Bring With You

1. Residence Card (or passport if you haven't received a Residence Card yet).
2. A “Moving-out Notification (*tenshutsu todoke* 転出届)” from your previous municipality if you are moving to Koriyama from within Japan.
3. The original and a Japanese translation of a document that proves your relationship if you are living with your family, such as a marriage certificate or a birth certificate.

Moving Within Or Out Of Koriyama

When you move within or out of Koriyama, you have to submit a “Change of Address Notification (*tenkyo todoke* 転居届).”

Moving within Koriyama	Within 14 days after moving to your new address	Residence Card
Moving out of Koriyama	Within 1 month before the planned moving date	Residence Card

Submitting a “Change of Address Notification” to the Post Office

My Number

Every person with a “Certificate of Residence (*juminhyo* 住民票)” in Japan will receive a “[My Number](#).” This number is a very important part of your personal information that is used for tax and social insurance purposes such as pension, unemployment insurance and health insurance. You will receive a My Number notification within two to three weeks after registering yourself as a resident for the first time. If you already have a My Number Card you have to complete the procedure to

change to address on the card within 90 days after submitting your “Moving-in Notification (*tennyu todoke* 転入届).”

2 Health Insurance



Health Insurance

If you have had residency status for more than three months you must enroll in the Public Health Insurance. You will receive a “Eligibility Confirmation Certificate (*shikaku kakuninsho* 資格確認書).” If you show the certificate at hospitals and clinics you will only have to pay 10% to 30% of the medical bill. If add the Health Insurance Card function to your My Number Card, you will be able to use your My Number Card as a Health Insurance Card (Myna Health Insurance) at clinics and hospitals.

Types of Public Health Insurance

There are three types of public health insurances.

1. Social Insurance
2. National Health Insurance
3. Medical Care System for Elderly in the Latter Stage of Life

Social Insurance

This insurance is for anyone who is employed at a company or other business. You can ask your employer or colleagues for more information about this insurance.

National Health Insurance

Those who do not have social insurance must enroll in the [National Health Insurance](#). Complete the procedures at the National Health Insurance Division at the City Hall, an Administration Center, or a Civil Service Center. You will receive a “National Health Insurance Premium Payment Slip (*nofusho* 納付書)” after completing the procedures. You have to make the payment before the deadline.

Necessary Documents to Bring

1. Residence Card
2. Certificate of Health Insurance Coverage Loss (*shikaku soshitsu shomeisho* 資格喪失証明書) if you are switching from social insurance to national health insurance. More information can be found on the [City of Koriyama Website](#).

High-Cost Medical Expense Benefit

If your monthly copayment is high in a certain month you can apply for a partial reimbursement that you will receive at a later date. You can also apply for an “[Eligibility Certificate for Ceiling-Amount Application](#) (*gendogaku tekiyo ninteisho* 限度額適用認定書)” ahead of time to reduce the out-of-pocket amount you must pay. If you use Myna Health Insurance, you don’t have to apply. Also, if you do not pay health insurance premiums, you will not be able to receive a discount in some cases. Medical Care System for Elderly in the Latter Stage of Life

People aged 75 or older will be automatically enrolled in the [Medical Care System for Elderly in the Latter Stage of Life](#). You don’t have to complete procedures. You will receive a payment slip to pay your premiums. Make sure to pay before the deadline.

3 Pension



Pension in Japan

People between the ages of 20 and 60 must enroll in the Public Pension System and pay premiums. Once you reach the age of 65, if you become disabled or if you become a widow or widower, you can receive pension.

Types of Public Pension Plans

Public pensions include the Employees' Pension and the National Pension.

Employees' Pension

You will be enrolled in the Employees' Pension if you are employed at a company or other organization. You can ask your employer for more information.

National Pension

People who are not enrolled in the Employees' Pension must enroll in the National Pension. You can complete the necessary enrollment procedures at the National Health Insurance Division at Koriyama City Hall.

Necessary Documents to Enroll in the National Pension

1. Residence Card and passport.
2. Certificate of Social Health Insurance Coverage Loss (*shakai hoken shikaku soshitsu shomeisho* 社会保険資格喪失証明書), or a Letter of Separation (*rishokuhyo* 離職票) if you are changing from the Employees' Pension to the National Pension.

National Pension Premium

The 2025 monthly premium for the National Pension is set at ¥17,510. The 2026 monthly premium is set at ¥17,920. If you are having difficulties paying the premium, you might qualify for an exemption or postponement of payment. Check the [City of Koriyama Website](#) for more information.

Lump-Sum Withdrawal Payment

If you have paid the national pension premiums for at least 6 months you can apply for a Lump-Sum Withdrawal Payment within two years after leaving Japan. If somebody else in Japan fills in the application for you, you must also submit a letter of proxy. You can complete the procedures at a Pension Office. 4. Taxes



Types of Taxes

Everyone who lives in Japan has to pay a variety of taxes, such as the individual inhabitant tax (*juminzei* 住民税), income tax (*shotokuzei* 所得税), and motor vehicle tax (*jidoshazei* 自動車税).

Individual Inhabitant Tax

You have to pay this tax if you have an address in Japan as of January 1 and had income in the previous year. You will receive a payment slip from the City Hall which you have to pay before the payment deadline. In some cases your employer may deduct the amount from your salary and pay it on your behalf.

Income Tax

This tax is imposed on the income that you earn. Your employer might deduct the amount from your salary and pay it on your behalf.

Motor Vehicle Tax

You have to pay this tax if you own a motor vehicle as of April 1. This tax is separated into categories, based on the type of motor vehicle. You will receive a payment slip which you have to pay before the deadline.

Other Taxes

Other taxes include the [Fixed Property Tax](#) if you own a house or land, and the consumption tax when buying goods.

Leaving Japan and Taxes

When you leave Japan before receiving your tax notice must assign someone who lives in Koriyama as their “[Tax Agent](#) (*nozei kanrinin* 納税管理人).” You can complete the procedure at the Property Tax Division at the City Hall, an Administration Center or at a Civic Service Center.

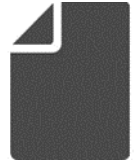

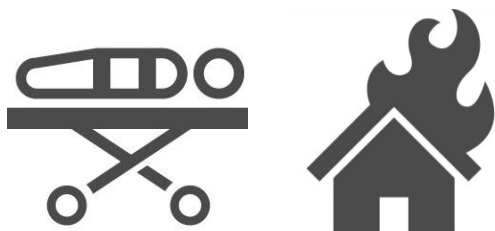
6. Emergencies



What Number to Call during an Emergency

In Japan there are two numbers you can call in case of an emergency. Do NOT call them for other purposes.

119 Medical Emergencies and Fire



Call 119 in case of a medical emergency, serious injury, or fire. Do NOT call this number for consultation, questions, or if you are able to go to the hospital yourself.

110 Police



Call 110 to report crimes or traffic accidents. Do NOT call this number for consultation or questions.

Koriyama Holiday and Nighttime Medical Emergency Center

8. Disasters



Recent Major Disasters in Koriyama

In March 2011 the Great East Japan Earthquake and the subsequent accident at the Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Plant took place. In more recent years the East Japan Typhoon, earthquakes in the sea near Fukushima, and floods have happened.

Potential Impacts of Disasters

1. You may be unable to use the telephone or internet.
2. Trains and buses may stop working.
3. Road may be blocked by debris.
4. You may be unable to use electricity, gas, and water.
5. You may be unable to purchase goods.
6. Schools and other facilities may be closed and turned into evacuation shelters.

How to Prepare Yourself for a Disaster

It is important to prepare for a disaster in order to protect yourself should one occur. The City of Koriyama has made a video in Easy Japanese, English and Vietnamese with some helpful tips on what to do, as well as a handbook in Easy Japanese, English, Chinese, Korean, Vietnamese, and Tagalog.

Reminders

1. Garbage should be properly separated and thrown away on the predetermined day and location. Garbage that is thrown away on the wrong day or at the wrong location will not be collected.
2. Garbage should be thrown away between 6:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m. on the day of collection (no later than 7:00 a.m. if you live in Ekimae 1 and 2-chome, Nakamachi, and Omachi 1-chome).
3. Do not remove garbage from garbage collection points.

10. Housing



Renting a House

There are two ways to rent a house in Japan. Public housing, and private rental housing.

Public Housing

There is [prefectural housing](#) that is provided by the Prefecture of Fukushima, and [municipal housing](#) that is provided by the City of Koriyama. You have to meet certain criteria, such as a certain income, in order to qualify for public housing.

Private Rental Housing

You can search for a house at a real estate agent (*fudosanya* 不動産屋). Keep in mind that in Japan you may have to pay a security deposit (*shikikin* 敷金), key money (*reikin* 礼金), and a renewal fee (*koshinryo* 更新料) in addition to the rent when you rent a house.

11. Pregnancy



Procedures to Complete When You Become Pregnant

Submit a “Notification of Pregnancy (*ninshin todoke* 妊娠届)” at the City Hall.

Necessary Documents to Bring With You

1. Notification of Pregnancy (either from the hospital or at a counter).
2. A document that shows your My Number.

3. Identification such as your passport or Residence Card.

4. Koriyama Nishi Health Center (inside the Katahira Administration Center)
5. Parenting and Family Consultation Division (on the third floor of Parenting and Family Support Center “Niko Niko Kodomo Kan”)

You will receive your [Maternal and Child Health Handbook](#) and the [Mother and Child Health Leaflet](#). These documents are free and are written in Japanese and English.

Maternal and Child Health Handbook

This handbook is for keeping records of the mother’s prenatal period and the health of her child, such as the child’s vaccinations. Always take this handbook with you during hospital visits. You will need this handbook even if you move to a different municipality.

Mother and Child Health Leaflet

You will undergo periodic health checkups at the hospital during your pregnancy. You need this leaflet to receive a subsidy for the cost of your [prenatal and postnatal health checkups](#), as well as for the hearing test for your newborn baby. Always take this leaflet with you during hospital visits, as well as your Handbook and your health insurance card.

Financial Support Benefit for Pregnant Women

Women who are pregnant are eligible to receive a Pregnancy Support Benefit. The application procedure is completed at the same time you submit your pregnancy notification.

Please bring something that shows the bank account information of the pregnant person (such as a bankbook or cash card).

12. After Your Baby Is Born



Procedures to Complete After Your Baby Is Born

Submit a “Notification of Birth (*shussho todoke* 出生届)” within 14 days after your baby is born. If you and your baby will stay in Japan for more than 60 days after birth, you will have to [fill in documents at the Immigration Services Agency of Japan](#) within 30 days after birth. You most likely also have to fill in some documents at the embassy or consulate of your home country. Contact your embassy or consulate in Japan to check what procedures you will have to complete.

Notification of Birth

Where to Complete the Procedure

Submit the Notification at the City Hall where the child was born, or where the father or mother lives.

Necessary Documents to Bring With You

1. Notification of Birth (available at your hospital)
2. Maternal and Child Health Handbook
3. Identification of the person submitting the Notification.

Who Can Submit?

Only the father or the mother of the child can submit the Notification.

Other Procedures

National Health Insurance, Childbirth Lump-Sum Allowance, and Reduction of National Health Insurance Premium

Complete the procedure to enroll your child in the National Health Insurance within 14 days after birth. If a person enrolled in the National Health Insurance gives birth, the head of the household will receive a Childbirth Lump-Sum Allowance. If you are not using the direct payment method (meaning the City will directly pay the hospital), you will need to submit a request at the City Hall. Furthermore, the mother's Health Insurance premiums will be lowered for a certain amount of months.

If you are not enrolled in Koriyama's National Health Insurance, ask your company for more information.

Immunizations and Infant Health Checkups

Immunizations make children less susceptible to disease. They also have the effect of preventing the spread of diseases throughout society. About one month after a baby’s birth, the City mails out the “Sukusuku Set” — a set of documents required for immunization and infant health checkups. Make sure to bring these documents with you for immunizations and infant health checkups.

You can bring your children to a day care center if both parents are working or if you cannot look after your children due to pregnancy or other reasons. There are licensed and unlicensed day care centers.

13. Education



Kindergartens and Certified Children's Centers

Kindergarten

Kindergartens are schools just like elementary and junior high schools. Children past their third birthday and up to before they enter elementary school are eligible to enroll. Day care hours are generally 4 hours per day. Extended day care services are available before and after the start and end of standard day care hours. Educational content and admission requirements vary from kindergarten to kindergarten. There are 27 private kindergartens in Koriyama. Certified Children's Centers

Certified Children's Centers provide education, day care, and parenting support for parents. Children zero years of age and older up to before elementary school age are eligible to enroll. These centers offer 4 hours of day care, just as kindergartens do, as well as 8- or 11-hour day care depending on the parents' working hours. There are 5 certified children's centers (kindergarten classification) in Koriyama. Parents must file a request for certification to enroll their children. Compulsory Education (Elementary and Junior High Schools)

Elementary school enrollment procedures

Children that are registered as residents in Koriyama are able to enroll in elementary school in the first April following their sixth birthday. Submit an Application for Admission of International Student at the School Education Promotion Division. The Koriyama Board of Education determines the school where your child will enroll depending on where you live.

After you submit your Application for Admission of International Student, you will receive an Enrollment Notice by mail in early October of the year before your child's enrollment year. Your child must receive a pre-enrollment physical examination on the date indicated on the Enrollment Notice. Make sure your child takes this examination. If you do not receive the Enrollment Notice because you moved to a different address, or have lost the Notice, please contact the Education

Management Division. The Enrollment Notice is also used during the entrance ceremony. Please do not throw it away.

Junior High School Enrollment Procedures

Enrollment Notices are handed out to sixth grade students at elementary schools. Students submit their Enrollment Notice to their new school on the day of enrollment. The Enrollment Notice is an important document and is to be submitted at the entrance ceremony. Please do not throw it away. You will receive an invitation to an enrollment orientation from the school where your child will be enrolling. Make sure to attend the orientation.

Purchasing your child's school uniform will take some time. After attending the enrollment orientation, and once you are clear on what preparations need to be made, make sure to start preparations as soon as possible.

Enrolling in High School

High Schools

Most children in Japan go on to high school after graduating from junior high school. In junior high school, you will have opportunities to discuss your child's education with their homeroom teacher. Be sure to discuss with your child about what they have in mind for the future. If you are unsure about something, ask others around you or teachers. Foreign children who have been in Japan for only 6 years or less may be eligible to take a special entry test for enrolling in prefectural high schools. Asaka Kaisei High School is the only prefectural high school in Koriyama where international students can take the test.

Public Transportation in Koriyama

Trains, buses, and shared-ride cabs are available within Koriyama.

How to Ride a Train

1. Check the route map for the fare to your destination.
2. Purchase your ticket at the ticket vending machine. Tickets for limited express trains and Shinkansen can be purchased at the “Midori no Madoguchi.”
3. Insert your ticket into the ticket gate machine and go through the ticket gate.
4. Board your train.

How to Take a Bus (Paying in Cash)

1. Make sure to have small change in hand. 1,000 yen bills can be exchanged. 5,000 and 10,000 yen bills are not accepted.
2. Find out which buses are on the route to your destination.
3. Board the bus through the rear door.
4. Take a numbered ticket from the machine near the door.
5. As the bus approaches the bus stop where you want to get off, press the stop button.
6. Stand up from your seat after the bus stops.
7. Drop the numbered ticket and fare in the fare box next to the driver's seat. No change is given.

8. Get off the bus from the front door.

It is advised to get a smart card for public transport. You can also use your credit card or other mobile payment methods.

Shared-ride Taxies

Shared-ride taxis are available in the following areas in Koriyama: the Hiwada area, Tamura area, Nishita area, Mihota area, Ose area, Kikuta area, Katahira area and Nakata area, as well as in a part of the Atami area and Asaka area. The fare is ¥500 for adults, ¥250 for high school students or younger and people with a disability, and free for up to two children under 6 years of age per accompanying adult. This shared-ride taxi service is available for everyone, but reservation by phone is necessary.

A Valid Driver's License

To drive an automobile or motorcycle in Japan, you must carry an appropriate driver's license. Always carry your driver's license with you when you drive.

Valid Driver's Licenses That Allow You to Drive in Japan

1. Driver's license obtained in Japan
2. International driver's license issued by a Geneva Convention signatory country.
3. A foreign driver's license (Switzerland, Germany, France, Belgium, Monaco, and Taiwan) with a Japanese translation prepared by a party designated by Japanese government ordinance.

Japan's Traffic Rules

In Japan cars drive on the left side and people walk on the right side of the road. Bicycles are defined as vehicles and therefore must be driven on the left side of the road. Make sure to follow the traffic rules and traffic lights. If you have to turn right on a bicycle, cross the crosswalk with pedestrians. Wear a helmet when you ride your bicycle.
