How to Stay Safe During Typhoons and Heavy Rain



June usually marks the start of the rainy season, as well as the typhoon season which lasts roughly until October. Koriyama City has suffered its share of flooding damage over the decades.

GOVID-19 Vaccination Program (Update)

The COVID-19 vaccination program in Koriyama has started for citizens 65 years of age and older. Depending on the supply of vaccines, Vaccination **Tickets** will be sent by mail. Tickets



are being sent out in the following order: (1) citizens 65+ years of age, (2) people with underlying medical conditions, (3) people working at elderly care facilities, (4) all other citizens.



The envelope will include this vaccine ticket, with a ticket number. This number

A Pre-vaccination Screening Questionnaire will also be included. Please fill in the questionnaire before going to the vaccination venue or clinic. A translation of the questionnaire can be found on the website below, but please fill in the original Japanese questionnaire.

Once you have received your ticket, you can make a reservation at either a Collective Vaccination Venue, or your local clinic. For details, Koriyama City has a page with

information on the roll-out of the COVID-19 vaccine in English and Easy Japanese. It includes information on making reservations, consultation services and more.
