

## Museum of Art: "Ukiyoe that Challenges Kuniyoshi, Yoshitoshi... and More!" Exhibit

Until the 6th of June, the Koriyama City Museum of Art present an exhibition on 19th century ukiyo-e paintings. Utagawa Kuniyoshi (1797-1861) is known for creating dynamic ukiyo-e during the late Edo to early Meiji periods (latter-half of the 19th century). His apprentice Yoshitoshi Tsukioka (1839-1892) is considered the last great ukiyo-e master. The

exhibition features about 150 rich, expressive works from a group of artists whose period of time provided them with a lively curiosity and new ways of thinking.

Languages: English, Chinese, Spanish, Portuguese, Korean, Tagalog, Thai, Vietnamese, Indonesian, Nepali, French, German, Italian, Russian, Malay, Burmese, Khmer, Mongolian and Sinhalese.

# COVID-19 Vacchation Program (Update)

The COVID-19 vaccination program in Koriyama has started for citizens 65 years of age and older. Depending on the supply of vaccines, Vaccination Tickets will be sent by mail. Tickets



will be sent out in the following order: (1) citizens 65+ years of age, (2) people with underlying medical conditions, (3) people working at elderly care facilities, (4) all other citizens.



The envelope will include this vaccine ticket, with a ticket number. This number is used to make your reservation.

A Pre-vaccination Screening Questionnaire will also be included. Please fill in the questionnaire before going to the vaccination venue or clinic. A translation of the questionnaire can be found on the website below, but please fill in the original Japanese questionnaire.

Once you have received your ticket, you can make a reservation at either a Collective Vaccination Venue, or your local clinic. For details, Koriyama City has a page with information on the roll-out of the COVID-19 vaccine

in English and Easy Japanese. It includes information on making reservations, consultation services and more.
