Spring is the time for one of Japan's most iconic natural and cultural phenomena: cherry blossoms (sakura). Fukushima Prefecture has a number of amazing cherry-blossom watching locations, such as the ancient Takizakuratree in neighboring Miharu, or Hanamiyama in Fukushima. Koriyama City itself too is home to a number of great spots, many of which have their own sakura festivals with stalls lined up for the crowds who flock to see the beautiful blossoms. Due to the relatively warm winter this year, the sakura-season is expected a bit earlier than usual. At the time of writing, the expected blossoming period is early April (April 5th, according to the Japan Weather Association (tenki.jp), may change depending on weather conditions).

The Cherry-Blossoms of Kaiseizan Park

The cherry-blossoms of Kaiseizan Park are closely connected to the story of the development of modern-day Koriyama. Koriyama was once a small town on the road northwards from Edo. The Asaka Plains to the west could not be used for farming due to the lack of a water source. Local merchants started the Kaiseisha company, with the aim of developing the lands. One of the works was the digging of the irrigation pond where Kaiseizan Park now lies. They surrounded the pond with thousands of cherry trees, to symbolize the dreams they shared towards the development of the area. The trees still blossom every year, and have become Koriyama's most popular destination for cherry-blossom watching.

Agreement with Hungarian Swimming Association

On the 30th of January, Koriyama signed an agreement with the Hungarian Swimming Association for the organization of training camps towards the Tokyo Olympic and Paralympic Games in 2020. The agreement was signed in the



Hungarian capital of Budapest by the head of the Hungarian Swimming Association, and Mayor Shinagawa of Koriyama City. The Hungarian Swimming Team, including bronze medalist **Tamás Kenderesi**, spent two weeks at the Koriyama Shinkin Kaiseizan Pool in October 2018, to the great satisfaction of both parties. The next training camps are scheduled for later this year (more details to follow).
