The band will give a show at the Koriyama City Cultural Center on Tuesday the 2nd of April. The show will start at 18:30. 

Memories of Ghibli - Orchestral Dream Concert

Feeling like an afternoon of wallowing in nostalgia and beautiful music? On Sunday the 3rd of March, the Koriyama City Cultural Center will be the stage for the 'Memories of Ghibli - Orchestral Dream Concert.' The 'Dream Chamber Orchestra' will play legendary composer Joe Hisaishi's amazing music from the soundtracks of the films My Neighbor Totoro, Ponyo, Spirited Away, Castle in the Sky, Kiki's Delivery Service and Princess Mononoke. Voice actress from various Ghibli films (incl. the voice of Nausicaä from the film 'Nausicaä of the Valley of the Wind') will guide you through Ghibli's forest of dreams, supported by vocal group The Breeze Adventures, and led by conductor Takao Tsukada.

Tickets are ¥2,000 (¥1,000 junior-/senior high school students, ¥500 for younger, half price for wheelchair seating), and are available at the Cultural Center and the Usui Dept. Store (5F). The show will start at 14:00.

Brueghel: Lecture Concert at the Chuo Community Center

Koriyama City Museum of Art's grand exhibition 'Brueghel: 150 years of an Artistic Dynasty,' is still on display until the 31st of March. The museum invited the two amazing musicians to help bring the exhibition to life with a special **Lecture Concert** on the 1st of March. At the Koriyama City Chuo Community Center (note: not at the museum!), harpsichordist/pianist Toshiki Tsumuraya will perform music of the time of the Brueghel dynasty

(16th-17th century). In the latter half of the concert, violinist **Noé Inui** will give a performance. Inui studied at the Royal Conservatory of Brussels, and has strong ties with Fukushima Prefecture, having performed here on various occasions. Admission is free, but seating is limited to 500 people. Speed Skating Inter-High in Koriyama

The speed skating tournament of Japan's biggest high school sports event, the 'Inter-High School Championships,' was held at the Bandai-Atami Ice Skating Rink from the 23rd until the 26th of January. 306 participants from all over Japan assembled at the opening ceremony at YRACS (Yurakkusu) Atami, where one of the athletes from Koriyama gave the Fair Play-pledge. Various students from schools in Koriyama (Koriyama Commercial High School and Koriyama Kita Technical High School) participated as well. The events were the 500m, 1,000m, 1,500m, 5,000m, 10,000m, 2,000m relay and the Team Pursuit. The girls of the Koriyama Commercial High School won the bronze medal in the Team Pursuit; an amazing performance, considering these are the top athletes of Japan in their age group. It was also the first time for Fukushima Pref. to win a medal at this prestigious event!





Koriyama's new Frontier Ambassadors: GreeeeN!

Koriyama has a number of prominent (former) residents and people with ties to the city, who promote Koriyama in- and outside of Japan. They include famous artists, athletes, academics and many others. The latest addition to this eclectic group: the one and only GreeeeN! The music group GreeeeN was formed when the four members HIDE, navi, 92 and SOH met each other while studying dentistry at the Ou University in Koriyama. They keep their faces hidden and never reveal their identity, in order for it not to interfere with their careers as dentists. They are best known for their smashhit 'Kiseki' which was number 1 in the Japanese charts when it was released in 2008, and has become a karaoke-staple ever since. The song is also the first thing many people here when they first set foot in Koriyama, as it is the chime that plays after a bullet-train has stopped at Koriyama Station. You can

also find the big green door in front of Koriyama Station set up in honor of this band. As the latest Frontier Ambassadors for Koriyama, they will help promote the city's affairs and activities.





Denso Airybees' First Home Games in Koriyama!

On the 2nd and 3rd of February, the Denso Airybees played their first games in Koriyama in a sold-out Horaiya Sogo Gymnasium, against the Okayama Seagulls and the Hisamitsu Springs (Kobe/Tosu). Preparing red Airybees tshirts for all visitors, the gymnasium was painted red and was buzzing with anticipation, although the buzzing may have been caused by the Airybees' mascot Bun-Bun. During breaks, Bun-Bun joined the Airybees' cheerleading squad the Ray-Glitters, as well as the cheerleading club of Koriyama High School (Blue Sparkle) and the Koriyama Women's University-attached High School's marching band. Despite losing their two games (Okayama: 0-3 and Hisamitsu: 2-3), the aggressive and playing style and the enthusiastic attitude of the players made a great impression. Especially the game against Hisamitsu Springs was exciting until the end, with the last set ending in 21-23, despite the Springs having 8 (!) national team players! Denso Airybees

In 2018, Koriyama City signed a collaboration agreement with the automotive parts manufacturer Denso's women's volleyball team 'Denso Airybees' to become the team's second home-city. The connection was established thanks to Denso's large factory in the neighboring Tamura. In the summer of 2018, athletes and trainers from the Airybees organized a volleyball-school for local junior high school students for several weeks.

The Airybees play in the professional V. League (women's division, Eastern conference), meaning they are part of the national top.
